Persian Ironwood– A tree worth having!

The Parrotia is native to the forest regions the Caspian Sea. This deciduous, slow-growing tree has a smooth gray, flaking bark, and lustrous green leaves.

Arriving in late winter, the Parrotia's tiny clusters of crimson-red flower are particularly nice in the sunshine.

The Persian Ironwood puts on a dramatic display in autumn, with its foliage turning rich colors of crimson, yellow and orange. Few trees have more brilliant autumn color!

The Parrotia is one of several tree varieties planted in the Village of Medina in 2008.
